A Nugget from Marshville's History

During the summer of 1876, the Central Railroad Co. of Wilmington laid tracks from the Port City through the N.C. Piedmont's pastureland to Charlotte. A depot was erected and it was called Beaver Dam, taking its name from Beaver Dam Creek which was located 2 miles south of the depot. The name "Beaver Dam" had a legitimate and creditable historical origin...but it took a negative turn.
