Sidewalk Project

The sidewalk project is a small part significant Downtown more Revitalization Grant provided by the Carolina Department οf North Commerce. NCDC created this grant assist smaller communities negatively impacted by the COVID pandemic to be better prepared in the future. The overall goal is to revive the life and vitality of our downtown by enhancing its visual aesthetics, improving its walkability, supporting local businesses. and Fortunately, we were awarded the funds to complete the sidewalk portion of the project, though we applied for much more.

The sidewalk project will widen the sidewalk on the south side of Main

Street from Elm Street to Cross Street by four feet.

In addition, they will include several parklets that will provide public seating platforms by converting open sidewalk spaces into vibrant gathering areas that promote local businesses and attract customers.

The diagonal parking will be converted to parallel parking for a two-fold purpose. First, the conversion will eliminate the danger now presented by the white street intersection. second. it will and four-foot accommodate the increase in the sidewalk. Another phase of the plan is to convert the lot at the corner of Cross and Main into a paved public parking lot that will replace the lost parking spaces.

Stay tuned to future issues for more of the overall plan for the downtown revitalization.
